THE SEVEN SISTERS

PA SALT HAS PASSED AWAY.

This is the opening of the first of what in my mind are the best books I have read in a long time.

From his mansion on the shores of Lake Geneva – Atlantis – Pa Salt has raised six adopted daughters, each named after one of the stars of a constellation called The Seven Sisters. This constellation features heavily in each of the books

Upon his death each sister is given an envelope with details to help find their origins. Each book is about one of the sisters and her journey to do just that.

First there is Maia, then Ally, Tiggy, Star, CeCe and finally Electra.

As you go through each of the books you will flip from present time to back in time as they progress in their journey to find out just where they come from.

Pa Salt (Atlas Tenit) is an enigma who raises all of his girls with the help of Ma (Marina – their nanny), Claudia – the housekeeper and Georg – his friend and lawyer.

The whys and wherefores of each of the girls origins are very different and detailed in each of the first six books. The seventh book – The Missing Sister – tracks the origins of the oldest and the final sister Merry who is in fact Pa's biological daughter and the oldest of the seven.

He also has an enemy in the form of Kreeg Eszu, his childhood friend who chases him across several decades to extract revenge from a childhood incident. This is later taken up by his son, the evil Zed Eszu.

Following on from the first seven books, each one about the various sisters there is a final one about Pa himself called Atlas. This one ties all the others together and is a must to read. It puts all of the others into perspective and answers a lot of questions. The end is a real nail biter. Unfortunately the original author passed away but as she had already had a lot of research and notes to go by the final book has been written by her son.

It seems like a lot of reading to get through but once you start I can guarantee they you will want to finish reading the whole eight books in the series


